- Below Grade Water Intrusion Heavy demolition taking place over the summer, including fountain at building 1. Waterproofing buildings to prevent water from coming back into the buildings.
- Concrete Finish Facilities Committee has chosen a smooth finish concrete as a design standard going forward.
